

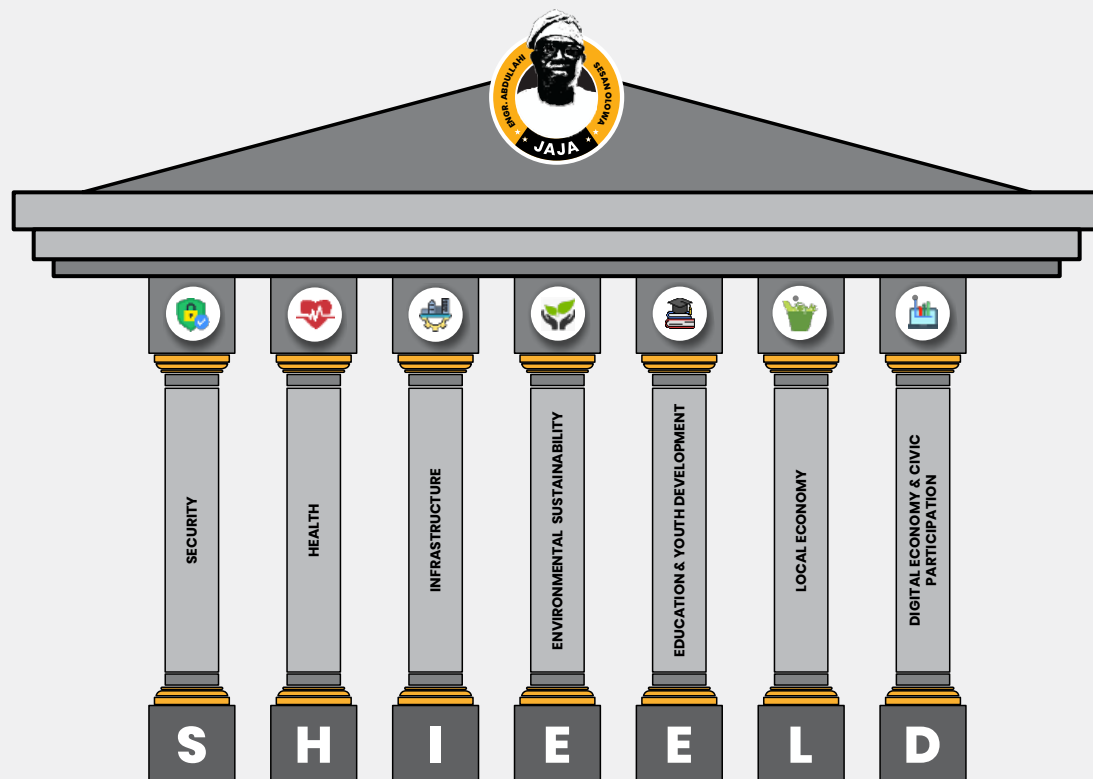

Our plan for securing the future of Ibeju-Lekki is anchored on a bold and strategic approach to safety and community protection. At the heart of this vision is the establishment of a state-of-the-art Security Command Centre that will serve as a central hub for surveillance, emergency response, and coordination among security operatives. This nerve center will ensure effective communication between citizens and security agencies, timely incident reporting, strategic intelligence gathering, and smart crime mapping to identify trends and high-risk zones. Community-centered surveillance systems will also be deployed to enable early detection and swift intervention.

To strengthen this framework, we will deepen our collaboration with the police, civil defence, and local security outfits to enable joint operations, intelligence sharing, and rapid response. Raising the standard of local security operations to align with the Lagos State Security Trust Fund model is also a key priority. Investments will be made in technology, training, and logistics to ensure our security personnel are well-equipped and prepared.

Furthermore, grassroots security efforts will be enhanced by equipping members of the Ibeju-Lekki Community Corps (Folumo) with patrol motorbikes, improving their ability to respond



swiftly, especially in hard-to-reach areas. Additional support will come in the form of patrol vehicles, protective gear, and modern infrastructure for all security operatives and local task forces.

Recognizing that safety extends beyond crime prevention, the plan includes the establishment of a dedicated fire service unit in Ibeju-Lekki. This unit will play a critical role in disaster response, ensuring swift action during fire outbreaks and other emergencies, thereby safeguarding lives and property across the community.

"Delivering quality, affordable, and inclusive healthcare through infrastructure renewal and community – based health insurance coverage"

A healthy community is a thriving community. From the onset, our administration prioritized healthcare as a cornerstone of human development and social equity. Over the last four years, we made deliberate investments in the renovation, equipping, and staffing of Primary Health Centres across Ibeju Lekki. These interventions have significantly improved service delivery, particularly for women, children, and the elderly through our targeted free medical outreach programs and wellness campaigns.

Currently, Ibeju Lekki hosts 14 primary healthcare centres of which 9 have undergone full scale upgrades. In our next term, we will complete the rehabilitation and upgrading of

the remaining PHCs in Iberekodo Otunla Oko Oba and Debojo ensuring all facilities meet a unified standard of care, safety, and accessibility especially in underserved and riverine areas.

To further deepen access and affordability, we will continue to implement a Community Health Insurance Scheme in partnership with accredited healthcare providers and in alignment with the Lagos State Health Insurance Initiative Ilera Eko. This initiative will prioritize indigent and vulnerable residents, guaranteeing access to primary and emergency care without the burden of out-of-pocket expenses.



Key focus areas will include

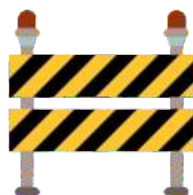
- Construction of a flagship modern Maternal and Child Hospital
- Provision of standby power systems and ambulance services
- Recruitment and capacity building of frontline healthcare workers
- Expansion of routine immunization and deworming programs for children
- Introduction of preventive health campaigns focusing on nutrition, hygiene, and communicable diseases
- Expansion of private hospital partnerships under the Lagos Health Insurance Scheme for free to subsidized treatment of vulnerable residents.
- Provision of access to emergency care through ambulance equipped facilities and align new Primary Health Care centres with maternal and neonatal health outcomes.
- This pillar is designed to deliver not just healthcare, but health security ensuring that every resident of Ibeju-Lekki , regardless of their income or location, can access care when it matters most.



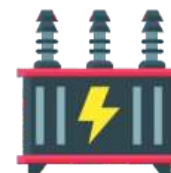

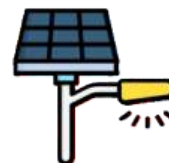

To enhance the quality of life in Ibeju-Lekki by expanding road infrastructure connectivity and facilitating access to affordable housing through strategic partnerships with private developers.

"Enhancing quality of life through strategic road connectivity, accessible housing, reliable power, and safety infrastructure in Ibeju-Lekki."

Infrastructure remains the backbone of progress. Our administration recognizes that sustainable development begins with access—access to roads, to housing, to opportunities. In our first term, we delivered critical road rehabilitation and construction projects across key communities including Orimedu, Idado, Igando, Lakowe and others. These projects were complemented by the installation of solar-powered streetlights to enhance security and nighttime mobility.





Building on this momentum, our second-term focus is the Rural-Urban Linkage Expansion Programme, — a targeted initiative to further open up the landscape of Ibeju-Lekki. This project will identify and upgrade strategic roads, each not less than 500 meters, across at least 10 wards, complete with:



Functional drainage systems



Durable surfacing



Solar-powered street lighting

To ensure these investments are protected and sustained, we will establish the Ibeju-Lekki Road Maintenance Agency, a dedicated local taskforce mandated to provide continuous maintenance, emergency response, and rapid repairs for all local roads. Our roads must not only be built, — they must be preserved.

In parallel, we are prioritizing affordable housing development through robust partnerships with reputable private developers. Our Build-and-Lease Housing Initiative will make home ownership or affordable rental a reality for residents of Ibeju-Lekki, especially low-to-middle income earners, without compromising on quality or dignity.

We will further expand infrastructure access by unlocking community-scale power solutions. As part of our Power Sector Renewal Drive, we will:

- Procure and distribute transformers for underserved communities
- Collaborate with state and federal agencies to expedite stalled transmission line projects
- Facilitate direct delivery of power infrastructure to communities through local government engagement
- Advocate for coastal electrification through ongoing projects targeting the riverine axis of Ibeju-Lekki



A community cannot thrive in darkness. Reliable electricity will drive commerce, power homes, and improve security across our wards.

In addition, we recognize the urgent need for safety and emergency preparedness. That is why we will establish the first-ever Ibeju-Lekki Fire Station, strategically located, fully equipped, and staffed by trained responders to serve our growing population and protect lives and property.

We will also pursue public-private partnerships (PPPs) to deliver modern shopping malls, housing estates, and a landmark multi-purpose event centre for weddings, civic events, festivals, and conferences an initiative that will boost tourism, culture, and revenue generation. Transparent land management and community-benefit clauses will guide all such projects.

This pillar reflects our belief that every citizen deserves infrastructure that enables upward mobility, supports livelihoods, ensures safety, and upholds community pride.

"Safeguarding our environment through green infrastructure, smart waste solutions, and climate-resilient initiatives that protect lives, and future generations."

Environmental protection is not just a policy priority, it is a moral and generational responsibility. As a coastal and climate vulnerable region, Ibeju-Lekki must take proactive steps to mitigate environmental risks, enhance sanitation, and promote a culture of sustainable living. Our administration has already taken bold strides in this direction.

In our first term, we rolled out several community driven environmental initiatives including:

- Monthly sanitation drives and public sensitization campaigns.
- Deployment of the "Keke Jaja" waste tricycles to improve household and market waste collection.
- Launch of the Cleaner Waterways Campaign to reduce flooding and improve drainage flow.

- Recruitment of over 400 environmental workers, including sweepers, gardeners, and environmental task force teams.

Looking ahead, we are set to significantly scale up waste management operations. With over 12 000 bags of waste currently cleared monthly using only 20 tricycles, our goal is to expand collection capacity to 40 000 bags monthly by:

- Procuring 3 high capacity waste compactors, 4 industrial Dino bins, and 20 additional Keke Jaja tricycles to boost our local waste collection and disposal network for faster, cleaner service across all wards.
- Through strategic public private partnerships, we'll establish Transfer Loading Stations (to streamline waste processing, reduce illegal dumping, and create income generating opportunities through localized recycling and resource recovery).





- We will institute a regular, scheduled desilting program to prevent flooding, improve water flow, and protect infrastructure, especially during the rainy season.
- Our markets will benefit from frequent sanitation drives, ensuring clean, safe environments for traders and customers, and promoting public health.
- We will construct modern public toilets in key locations to promote hygiene, dignity, and stop the spread of disease ensuring no resident is left without access to basic sanitation.

In tandem, we will formally launch the “Green Ibeju Project” a strategic environmental resilience plan focusing on:

- Tree planting campaigns across schools, health facilities, roadways, and coastal lines and urban places in partnership with Green NGOs and Climate Action Groups.

- Coastal protection initiatives in partnership with state agencies to combat erosion and preserve shoreline integrity.
- Recycling and waste to wealth programs aimed at converting waste into employment and economic value for youth and low income households.
- Through these initiatives, we will not only preserve the natural beauty of Ibeju-Lekki, but also create green jobs, promote public health, and protect our environment for future generations.
- Environmental sustainability is no longer a luxury it is a necessity. And Ibeju-Lekki will lead by example.

To empower the youth of Ibeju-Lekki through the launch of the Ibeju Digital Learning' initiative, while supporting higher education and fostering creativity by providing tertiary education grants and establishing technology innovation hubs.





"Empowering the next generation through digital learning, innovative education models, and youth-centered economic opportunities."

Education is the most powerful tool for transformation and in Ibeju Lekki we are determined to equip our youths with the skills and knowledge needed to lead, innovate, and thrive in a fast evolving world.

In our first term, we laid the groundwork for a revitalized educational landscape through the rehabilitation of dilapidated classrooms, provision of critical learning materials, and extensive scholarship and bursary programs to support indigent students at all levels of education. These interventions ensured that no child is left behind due to circumstance.

As we enter our second term, we are elevating our commitment through a multi pronged educational strategy. At the heart of this is the construction of Ibeju-Lekki Model Schools well equipped, digitally enabled learning environments designed to foster curiosity, creativity, and 21st century thinking in our children.

To complement this, we are launching the "Ibeju Digital Learning Initiative", a comprehensive e-learning and skills acquisition program that will serve as a springboard for young people to enter the digital economy. Through strategically located Digital Innovation Hubs, residents will gain access to short term, high impact training in:

- Digital marketing social media management
- Content creation writing
- 2D/3D animation
- Website, coding and app development
- Music production and sound engineering

Our goal is simple, make Ibeju Lekki youth job ready while nurturing a new wave of tech driven entrepreneurs.





Our goal is simple make Ibeju-Lekki youth job ready in 1 to 3 months, while nurturing a new wave of tech driven entrepreneurs. Alongside model schools and digital hubs offering training in coding, animation, and entrepreneurship we will;

- Institutionalize innovation hubs, where youths can incubate ideas, connect with investors, and access grants.
- We will also deepen our vocational training programs, providing tailored starter kits in areas such as tailoring, crafts, and design ensuring that every trained participant leaves with the tools to start their own business.

Lastly through strategic collaborations with private sector partners, we will host periodic employment and entrepreneurship fairs, creating direct access to internships, job placements, and funding opportunities for small startups.

This pillar is a clear investment in the future because when we empower our youth, we empower our community.

Economic development at the grassroots is essential for sustainable progress. Over the past four years, our administration has worked tirelessly to strengthen Ibeju-Lekki's economic foundation by empowering micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), promoting agri-business, and revitalizing community-based commerce.

We launched grant and cooperative loan schemes tailored to support local traders, artisans, and start-ups—especially women and youth—enabling them to scale their operations and access new markets. In the agricultural sector, we facilitated input distribution and training programs through dedicated empowerment schemes and initiated agricultural processing centres to support value addition, particularly for cassava and plantain farmers.

In our second term, we will deepen these efforts through a Regional Cooperative Development Fund, seeded with initial capital from the local government, and structured to grow into a ₦100 million portfolio within a few years. The cooperative will operate as an official extension of the local government, providing open membership and funding to business owners across Ibeju-Lekki and serving as a platform for economic empowerment and enterprise support. This cooperative will provide flexible financial support and business advisory services for community-based enterprises.

Other key initiatives include:

- **Market Restructuring Program:** Developing specialized markets such as cattle markets, auto parts hubs, foodstuff clusters, designed for efficiency, hygiene, and economic viability.



- **Transportation and Trade Facilitation:** Establishing structured motor parks and bus terminals to ease logistics for both traders and commuters.
- **Trade Fairs and Business Expos:** Organizing quarterly expos to showcase local products and attract buyers, investors, and distributors.
- **Tourism-Led Economic Expansion:** Partnering with private enterprises to develop secure entertainment hubs, beach resorts, and cultural heritage centres—positioning Ibeju-Lekki as a prime leisure and business destination in Lagos State. As a tourism destination, we will curate seasonal food, fashion, and cultural festivals.

This pillar represents our belief in people-powered prosperity. By investing in local talents, products, and innovations, we are not just growing businesses—we are building a resilient, self-sustaining economy that benefits every resident.

To deepen transparency and citizen engagement in Ibeju Lekki through a dedicated mobile app for lodging complaints, tracking government projects, and providing feedback, complemented by regular public town halls and inclusive budgeting mechanisms.

"Strengthening public trust through transparent governance, inclusive decision-making, and technology-driven citizen engagement."

Good governance thrives on accountability, transparency, and citizen involvement. In an era where technology is shaping how people interact with leadership, we are committed to building a smarter, more participatory Ibeju-Lekki—one where residents are not just informed but actively involved in shaping local development.

Over the past four years, we initiated the digital transformation of local government services, including business registration and enumeration systems that have improved efficiency, boosted internally generated revenue, and enhanced transparency. We also provided digital tools to support local security architecture, contributing to safer neighbourhoods.

In our second term, we will take digital governance to the next level with the launch of the “Ibeju-Lekki Digital Civic Centre on both mobile and web, and available on Android and iOS. This platform will:

- Enable real-time lodging of complaints and service requests
- Allow citizens to track capital projects by ward or sector
- Host community polls and feedback forums
- Provide service delivery updates and public announcements

To ensure impact, the app will be backed by a dedicated Local Government Response Team and will be supported by radio jingles, SMS alerts, and community sensitization drives to guarantee widespread adoption.



Civic Engagement in Action

Alongside our digital innovations, we will institutionalize Quarterly Public Town Halls across all wards. These sessions will:

- Provide direct accountability channels between government and citizens
- Feature departmental progress reports based on a standardized “Ward Report Template”
- Capture and document community feedback for integration into policy planning.



Inclusive Budgeting & Participatory Development

We believe budgeting should be a community affair. We will establish Community Budget Councils (CBCs) in every ward, composed of a cross-section of residents—youth, women, elders, artisans, professionals—who will help prioritize projects, monitor expenditure, and ensure equitable development.

Key actions include:

- Publishing simplified budget summaries in both English and Yoruba.
- Broadcasting budget highlights via the app and town hall briefings.
- Quarterly budget implementation tracking—both digitally and physically.



Monitoring, Evaluation & Transparency Dashboard

To close the feedback loop, we will deploy a hybrid (online/offline) monitoring system supported by an internal Digital Governance Dashboard, which will:

- Track average response time to citizen complaints.
- Highlight the most-requested community projects.
- Report on resolved vs pending service issues.



Traditional Partnership for Safer, Stronger Communities

Our administration will forge a strong alliance with traditional rulers, community leaders, and local vigilante networks to strengthen grassroots security and deepen community engagement. Through regular dialogue, joint security assessments, and culturally

rooted conflict resolution mechanisms, we will build a safer, more united Ibeju-Lekki where every resident feels protected, heard, and included in shaping the future of our communities.

This pillar represents a bold step toward a more open, responsive, and digitally enabled local government— a government that listens, learns, and leads with its people at the center of every action.
